


Overall Ratings – MLS Left Backs in specialist Championship Framework




What does this mean?









Kai Wagner Progressive Passes

This map shows Kai Wagner's progressive passes over the last five games. A forward-thinking left-back, he consistently looks to advance play from deep, mixing shorter line-breaking passes into midfield with longer switches into advanced wide areas. His distribution regularly finds teammates in attacking positions, with multiple entries into the final third and edge of the box. Wagner's range and execution make him a reliable outlet in build-up while also providing penetration and variety to disrupt opposition defensive structures.




Championship LB Progressive Passes

The map below shows Championship LB's progressive passes over the last five games. He plays in a straightforward manner, moving the ball safely down the left flank and into wide attacking areas. While reliable and consistent, his influence in deeper build-up is limited, with little progression through central zones or variation in his passing. He provides stability and territory, though his technical limitations mean he has a reduced impact on build-up play.




Kai Wagner Key Passes

These are Kai Wagner's 24 key passes from last season, each leading directly to a shot. Operating as a left-back, he consistently delivers into advanced areas, with the majority aimed at the edge of the box or into central attacking zones. His crossing and final-third passing make him a clear creative outlet, reflected in an xA of 0.32 per 90, one of the strongest outputs for his position. Wagner's distribution underlines his value as an attacking full-back, offering consistent chance creation from the left side.




Championship LB Key Passes

Across last season, Championship LB produced just 10 key passes, each leading directly to a shot. Operating as a left-back, his chance creation was limited, with most passes coming from straightforward deliveries into the box rather than varied or incisive play. His xA of 0.03 per 90 reflects a minimal creative influence, offering little impact in possession beyond basic service. He provides defensive stability, but his contribution to chance creation remains very restricted.




Kai Wagner Touch Map

Wagner's touch map illustrates just how involved he is down the left flank, with consistent activity in both deep build-up and advanced areas. He regularly collects possession in his own half to initiate progression, while also pushing high into the final third to support attacks. Across his last five games he registered 426 touches, an average of 85 per game, which is unusually high for a left-back and closer to central midfielder levels. This underlines his role as both a reliable outlet in possession and an attacking full-back who contributes consistently to chance creation.



Championship LB Touch Map

This touch map reflects a more conservative profile at left-back, with the majority of his involvement coming deeper in his own half and along the defensive third. While he does advance into wide attacking areas, his overall influence on possession phases is limited, with fewer touches in central zones or the final third. Across his last five games he registered 304 touches, an average of 61 per game, underlining a role focused more on defensive security and recycling possession rather than driving progression.



Kai Wagner Defensive Actions

Wagner's defensive actions are concentrated down the left flank, showing reliability in protecting his defensive channel while also stepping higher to press and disrupt wide attacks.







Championship Left Backs in Championship Fullback Framework

We analysed Kai Wagner's 2025 MLS data against every Championship left-back from the 2024–25 season. To ensure accuracy, we factored in a 15% difficulty adjustment to reflect the higher standard of the Championship, integrating this into our framework calculations to estimate how Wagner's performance would translate if he were to make the move.


For context, we have also included a current first-choice Championship left-back within the pizza chart. This allows a direct comparison, showing how both players rank on a 0-100 scale across key attributes, using our bespoke Championship Fullback framework model.









Set Pieces

Delivering extra Set Piece Value

Kai Wagner delivers the majority of Philadelphia Union's set-pieces, around 85 - 90% of corners and most wide free-kicks, helping drive their set-piece xG to 0.49 per game, compared to Portsmouth and West Brom's 0.38 as an example.

That 0.11 gap, over a Championship season, equates to several additional goals purely from dead-ball situations. With roughly 20% of all goals in the division scored from set-pieces (excluding penalties), adding a specialist like Wagner could give Championship clubs a vital tactical edge, turning routine corners and free-kicks into match-winning opportunities.



Injury History and Game Availability

Since signing for Philadelphia Union, Kai Wagner has been available for 209 of 224 MLS matches, giving him an outstanding 93% availability rate. Over seven seasons he has missed just 15 league games, which is remarkable for a fullback in such a physically demanding role.

This level of consistency reduces disruption to team structure and provides coaches with the confidence to build tactical systems around him. His durability not only safeguards tactical continuity but also lessens the financial and sporting risks associated with injuries. Wagner's reliability ensures his influence, whether through progressive play, defensive contribution, or set-piece delivery, is almost always present, making him both a technical asset and a dependable cornerstone in squad planning.

Technical

Wagner offers a well-rounded technical base that combines secure possession with consistent end product. His left foot provides a reliable outlet for switches of play and progressive distribution, enabling teams to move opponents laterally and open space in advanced areas. Beyond ball circulation, his crossing is a genuine weapon: he delivers with variety, able to whip balls into the near post or stand them up to the far post, giving forwards multiple types of service. For teams looking to increase their output from wide areas, Wagner's proven creativity from both open play and set-pieces represents a significant attacking upgrade.

Physical

Durability is one of Wagner's standout qualities. Across seven MLS seasons he has been available for selection over 90% of the time, missing very few games through injury or suspension. This level of availability ensures clubs would gain not just a quality player, but a consistently present one, crucial across a 46-game Championship season with its intensity and physical demands. He covers ground efficiently, with the capacity to repeat sprints on the overlap while still recovering defensively. His conditioning allows him to maintain output late into games, reducing drop-off and ensuring reliability across congested fixture periods.

Tactical

Defensively, Wagner shows strong positional awareness and a good understanding of when to engage versus when to delay, making him a steady presence in one-v-one duels. He balances his attacking instincts with discipline, rarely leaving unnecessary gaps behind him, which would be vital in the Championship's transitional game. Offensively, he integrates well into structured build-up, stepping into midfield pockets to connect play or overlapping aggressively when space opens up. This tactical flexibility means he can adapt to both a back four or wing-back role, while still offering defensive solidity against the pace and directness of Championship opposition.

Psychological

Wagner brings maturity, composure, and a clear sense of responsibility. As Philadelphia Union's set-piece specialist, he has shown confidence in delivering under pressure and consistency across multiple seasons, reflecting both self-assurance and professionalism. His mentality is steady rather than erratic: he offers teammates reassurance in possession and resilience out of it. For Championship clubs, he would bring an experienced, dependable figure who thrives on consistency and who is accustomed to being trusted in high-stakes situations. His leadership through reliability, rather than vocal dominance, would add an understated but valuable edge to the squad.


Summary

A transformative addition to the Championship

Bringing in Kai Wagner would represent a decisive move for clubs both on and off the pitch. At 28, he is in his prime years and has already established himself as one of Major League Soccer's standout full-backs, consistently ranking among the league leaders for defensive reliability, progressive passing, and chance creation from wide areas. His signing would immediately raise the level of the left-back position, providing a proven two-way contributor who can deliver security out of possession and genuine attacking value through his distribution, crossing, and set-piece delivery.

Wagner's availability record is exceptional, making him a dependable performer across the long Championship campaign. His durability and conditioning mean he can handle the intensity and fixture congestion of English football, offering stability in a role where continuity is vital. This ensures not just quality but consistency, reducing risk and enhancing reliability in one of the most demanding positions.

Beyond the pitch, Wagner brings profile and marketability. As a leading MLS player moving into the Championship, his arrival would generate interest beyond a clubs traditional fanbase, with potential to drive shirt sales and grow visibility in the North American market. Combined with his on-field impact, this makes the deal both a footballing and commercial opportunity.





Defensive Commitment: Strong in the tackle and willing to put his body on the line, showing concentration and awareness when tracking runners or blocking shots.


